

Economic Development Priority

Childcare desert

- 86% of North Country census tracts identified as childcare deserts
- In Lewis County, there are 7.8 children for each regulated childcare slot available and 94% of the county is considered a childcare desert.
- Rural community cannot support a Child Care Center
- Labor Shortage



County Support

Economic Development funding

\$50,000 for Cohort I – serving 20 individuals

ARPA funding

\$70,000 for Cohort II – aiming to serve 30 individuals interested in opening a regulated home daycare

Outcomes



- Started with 40 interested
 - Facebook...and lawn signs!
- Orientation attended by 20
- Expecting 8 to 9 new childcare providers
