Getting It Right From the Start

It is a foundation for early literacy, so that they are reading on grade level by the end of third grade, a key to future school success and high school graduation.

Supporting Family Success

The healthy growth and development of children starts with their parents. All parents must be able to provide stability and security for their children.

Protecting Vulnerable Children and Youth

Children in the care of the child welfare and juvenile justice systems need special protections. Separated from their parents and communities, they depend on government services for their health, safety and well-being. These systems must be held accountable to make sure that children's needs are met while in state care and that they return to safe and stable families or to other permanent homes.

FEBRUARY 2013 — In response to ACNJ's *Newark Kids Count 2013*, former Newark Mayor Cory Booker declares Newark is in a state of "crisis" because it is "losing its children" and vows action. Later, the mayor unveils a plan to address poverty, especially among Newark's youngest children and



establishes the Newark Early Childhood Policy Board. Pictured, ACNJ Executive Director Cecilia Zalkind with Mayor Booker.

OCTOBER 2012 — ACNJ's 2nd *Annual School Breakfast Report* drew support from statewide leaders. Agriculture Secretary Douglas Fisher, pictured above, serves breakfast to Newark high school students. The report resulted in many school districts changing the way they serve breakfast, reaching more "food-insecure" children each day.

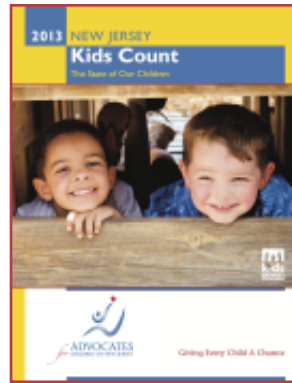


APRIL 2013 — ACNJ presents its report, *Keeping the Promise of Preschool*, to the Joint Committee on Public Schools, and urges lawmakers to support expansion of high-quality preschool to children across New Jersey. The Legislature endorses a \$10 million

down payment on the expansion and lawmakers begin talking publicly about the need for expanding access to quality early education in New Jersey.



MAY 2013 — ACNJ releases the 2013 *New Jersey Kids Count Report*, which measures child well-being statewide. ACNJ takes the Kids Count data on the road at regional forums across the state. Community members and decision-makers in all 21 counties create action plans to improve child well-being in their towns and cities.



MAY 2013 — ACNJ arranges for U.S. Congressman Rush Holt to visit a local preschool to build support for a federal proposal to expand high-quality preschool across the nation and in New Jersey, drawing media attention and getting the message out to the public and other decision-makers.

JUNE 2013 — ACNJ informs the media about the state's widely unnoticed attempt to limit information that can be released to the public when a child dies or nearly dies due to abuse or neglect. The news release garnered significant media attention.
