Child Care FundingTwo ways to pay:

- Private tuition by parents
- -Child care subsidy

Child Care Subsidy Eligibility

Initial eligibility:

- Must be at 200% of the federal poverty level
- For a family of four to be eligible, they must make less than \$53,000/year

Child Care Subsidy Payments

For Infants:

- \$1024.25/month
- \$236.55/week
- \$47.31/day
- \$5.91/hour for an 8 hour day

And there are consequences for both funding sources

Supply v. Demand

Child care in NJ:

As of 12/31/20

- 3,035 Licensed child care centers
- 1,449 Registered family child care homes

How Many Children are Served by Subsidy?

As of 12/31/20

- 40,951- Total number of children of all ages receiving subsidy
- 9,051-Total number of infants/toddlers receiving a subsidy

Child Care Availability 2017 ACNJ Report

- More than 207,000 children under the age of 3 living in families where both parents work (Some kind of child care is needed)
- Licensed centers only have the capacity to serve 55,600 infants/toddlers

Child Care and COVID-19

- Was a crisis before the crisis
- Closed for 3 ½ months
- Reopened: low enrollment
- Good news: More stable funding through subsidy payments

What's Happening NOW?

- Cost of doing business skyrocketed
- In the midst of a staffing crisis
 - -Federal dollars helped, still not enough to compete
 - -Minimum wage increases every year
- Child care enrollment bill
- American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding

ARPA Child Care Funding

- Two pots of child care funding
 - -Approximately \$267 million for Supplemental Child Care & Development Funds
 - -Approximately \$430 million for Child Care Stabilization funds

How does NJ Plan to Spend the Funding?

- Waiving parent copays in the child care subsidy program through the end of 2023
- Providing an additional \$300 per month per child for subsidy payments until the end of 2023
- Providing \$1,000 bonuses to help child care providers recruit new workers and retain existing staff
- Offering grants of \$20,000 \$80,000 to center-based child care providers to help stabilize their operations, including increased wages and facilities improvements.
 Family child care homes are eligible for grants up to \$2,000
- Providing family child care providers enrolled in *Grow NJ Kids* (New Jersey's child care quality rating and improvement system) with increased subsidy reimbursements based on increased levels of quality
- Providing incentives to child care programs to offer evening, weekend and nontraditional hours of care

Are the ARPA Child Care Dollars Enough?

- \$1,000 recruitment and retention bonuses to help child care providers recruit new workers and retain existing staff
- Center-based grants of \$20,000 \$80,000
- Providing incentives to child care programs to offer evening, weekend and non-traditional hours of care
