

Defining the Solution




It's as important as documenting the problem

- Develop strategies that can be used to fix the problem





The state legislature has not approved a subsidy rate increase since 2008.


At just \$4.00/hour per infant, the current rate is not enough to cover the true cost of caring for babies.

New Jersey lawmakers must raise the state child care subsidy rate for infants.






