- Registrants who are submitting this form by mail and are registering to vote for the first time: If you do not supply any of the information required by section 7, or the information you provide cannot be verified, you will be asked to provide a COPY of a current and valid photo ID, or a document with your name and current address on it to avoid having to provide identification at the polling place.  
**Note: ID Numbers are Confidential and will not be released by any governmental agency. Any person who uses such numbers illegally shall be subject to criminal penalties.**
- If you are homeless, you may complete section 8 by providing a contact point or the location where you spend most of your time.
- You may declare a political party affiliation or you may declare to be unaffiliated, regardless of any prior party affiliation. If you are a previously affiliated voter who wants to change political party affiliation or become unaffiliated, you must file this form no later than 55 days before the primary election in order to vote in the primary election. Completing section 13 is OPTIONAL and will not affect the acceptance of your voter registration application.



**Student Voter Registration & Voting**

Democracy is not a spectator sport. It requires continual work to protect it and keep it strong. And the best way to protect and strengthen our democracy is to participate in it.

You are entering a new phase of your lives where you will have even more influence in what happens in your local community, the state and the country. As a citizen, your active civic participation as a voter is essential in that process. And the first step in that process is to register to vote. As a 17 year old in New Jersey, you can register to vote now and your voter registration will become active on your 18th birthday. If you are 18 register now so you can participate in the General Election on November 8th.

**Register to vote online** or by downloading a printable postage paid form for your county.  
Want a convenient way to vote whether you're at home or away at school? After you register you can apply for a **Vote-By-Mail ballot**.

**To register in New Jersey, you must be:**

- A United States citizen
- At least 17 years old, though you may not vote until you have reached the age of 18
- A resident of the county for 30 days before the election
- You are not serving a sentence of incarceration as a result of a conviction of an indictable offense under the laws of this or another state or of the United States.

**You are not eligible to register to vote if:**

- You are serving a sentence of incarceration as a result of a conviction of an indictable offense under the laws of this or another state or of the United States.

If you are in college, you have the option to register from your college address or your parent's address. There are good reasons for registering and voting at either residence, but keep in mind, the final choice is yours.

**The registration deadline to vote is 21 days prior to Election Day**

You will receive a sample ballot about 1 week before the election that will indicate where your polling place is or you can use our polling place locator.

# In-Person Early Voting

- In-Person Early Voting for the 2024 General Election begins on **Saturday, October 26** and runs through **Sunday, November 3**
- Each NJ county will hold nine (9) days of early, in-person machine voting
- Each early voting location will be open **Monday through Saturday** from **10am to 8pm** and **Sunday** from **10am to 6pm**

# How Can I Return My Mail-in Ballot?

- **1... Mail:** It must be postmarked on or before 8pm on November 5
- **2... Secure Ballot Drop Box:** Place your ballot in one of your county's secure ballot drop boxes by 8:00 p.m. on November 5. Drop box locations can be found at [Vote.NJ.Gov](https://Vote.NJ.Gov)
- **3... Board of Elections Office:** Deliver your ballot in person to your county's Board of Elections Office by 8:00 p.m. on November 5. County contact information can be found at [Vote.NJ.Gov](https://Vote.NJ.Gov)
- **4.NOTE: Your Mail-in Ballot CANNOT be returned to your early voting location or polling place for this election**





## Here are the 3 ways you can vote in the upcoming General Election...

### 1. AT YOUR POLLING PLACE ON ELECTION DAY



**Vote in person** at your polling place, from **6:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on Election Day, Tuesday, November 5**. Accommodations will be made for voters with disabilities.

Go to [VOTE.NJ.GOV](https://www.vote.nj.gov) for your polling place, listed on the Polling Locations page.

### 2. IN-PERSON EARLY VOTING



This option enables all registered voters to cast their ballot **in person, using a voting machine, during a nine-day period prior to Election Day**. You can choose to vote, in person, when it's most convenient for your schedule.

No matter where you live in the county, you can vote your specific ballot at any of **your** county's designated in-person early voting sites. Find your county's sites at [VOTE.NJ.GOV](https://www.vote.nj.gov).

In-person early voting sites will be open **Saturday, October 26 through Sunday, November 3**. Hours will be **Monday-Saturday, 10:00 a.m.-8:00 p.m. and Sunday, 10:00 a.m.-6:00 p.m.** No appointment is necessary. Accommodations will be made for voters with disabilities.

### 3. VOTE BY MAIL



Registered voters can apply for a **mail-in ballot** by following the instructions found at [VOTE.NJ.GOV](https://www.vote.nj.gov) or contacting their County Clerk.

Then, VOTE and RETURN your ballot one of the following ways...

- **Secure Ballot Drop Box:** Place your mail-in ballot in one of your county's secure ballot drop boxes **by 8:00 p.m. on Tuesday, November 5**. Drop box locations can be found at [VOTE.NJ.GOV](https://www.vote.nj.gov).
- **Board of Elections Office:** Deliver your mail-in ballot in person to your county's Board of Elections Office **by 8:00 p.m. on Tuesday, November 5**. County Election Officials' contact information can be found at [VOTE.NJ.GOV](https://www.vote.nj.gov).
- **Mail:** Your mail-in ballot **MUST** be postmarked **on or before 8:00 p.m. on Tuesday, November 5** and be received by your county's Board of Elections **on or before Monday, November 11**.

**NOTE: Mail-in ballots CANNOT be returned to your early voting site or polling place.**

### How to Become a Poll Worker for the General Election

New Jersey's counties, in partnership with the New Jersey Division of Elections, are actively seeking residents to serve as poll workers for the upcoming General Election, Tuesday, November 5, 2024.

Here are the answers to three top questions about becoming a poll worker:

#### 1... WHY SHOULD I APPLY?

Your community needs you! By staffing a polling location, you will:

- Earn \$300 on General Election Day.
- See our great democracy in action, firsthand, and enjoy the feeling that comes with contributing to your local community, your state and your country.

#### 2... WHO CAN APPLY?

You can apply to serve as a poll worker in New Jersey if you:

- Are a United States citizen and a resident of New Jersey.
- Are a registered voter in the county in which you reside.
- Are at least 16 years of age. College and high school students are encouraged to apply.  
Note: Those under 18 years of age will work limited hours per shift and do not have to be registered to vote. Contact the County Board of Elections for further information.
- Are not running as a candidate in this election.

#### 3... WHAT ELSE DO I NEED TO KNOW?

To be a poll worker, you must be available to work from 6:00 am to 8:00 pm at an assigned polling place within your county on General Election Day, Tuesday, November 5. Hours may vary.

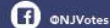

Comuníquese con la Junta Electoral del Condado para obtener más información.
- No se presentan como candidatos en estas elecciones.

#### 3... ¿QUÉ MÁS DEBO SABER?

Para ser trabajador electoral, debe estar disponible para trabajar de 6:00 a.m. a 8:00 p.m. en un centro de votación asignado dentro de su condado el Día de Elecciones Generales, el martes 5 de noviembre. El horario puede variar.

# General Election Day & Key Dates

Here are key deadlines for the ***upcoming General Election*** :

- **September 21:** Commencement of mailing of Mail-in Ballots for the General Election
- **October 15:** Deadline to Register to Vote for the General Election
- **October 29:** Deadline to apply for a Mail-in Ballot by Mail for General Election
- **October 26 – November 3:** In-Person Early Voting Period
- **November 4 at 3pm:** Deadline to apply for a Mail-in Ballot in person at your County Clerk's office
- **November 5:** General Election Day - Polls are open from 6:00am-8:00pm

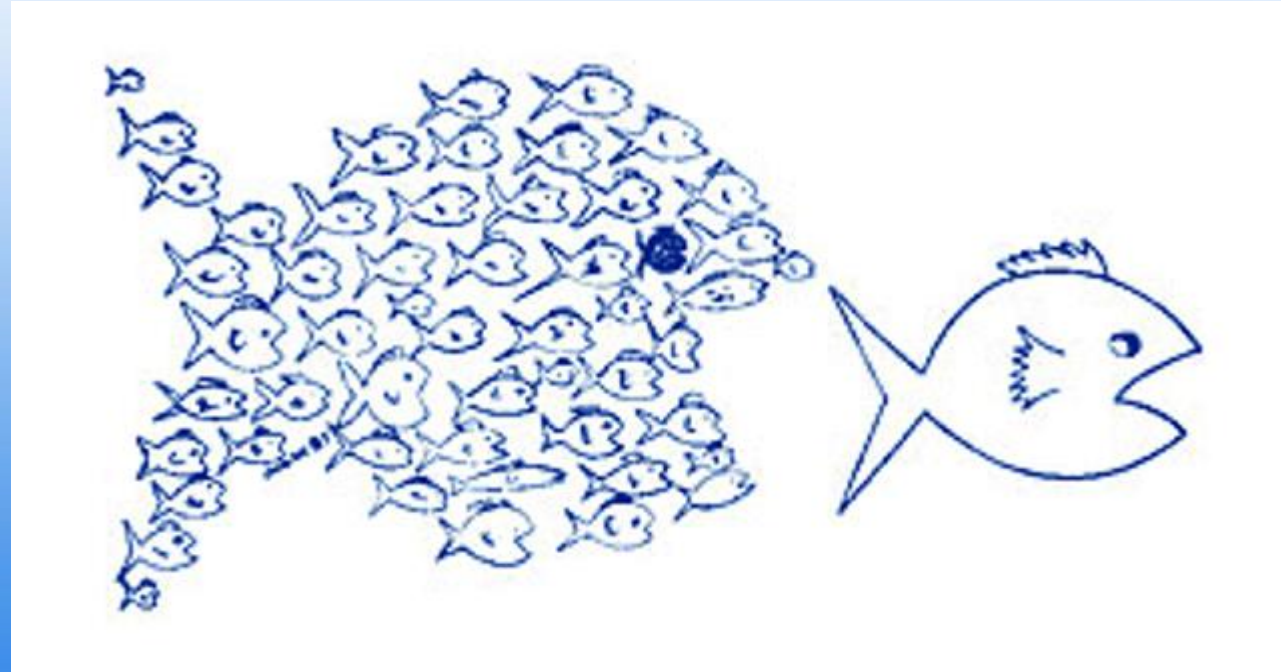

# NJ High School Voter Registration Week

- **The NJ High School Voter Registration Week Program is now in its third year.**
- This year it ran from April 14-20, in anticipation of the primary election voter registration deadline on May 14, 2024.
- Invites high schools and communities to facilitate the non-partisan registration of eligible 18-year-old high school students and eligible 17-year-old students, who will be 18 in time for the next election.
- Over the past 2 years it has influenced over 12,000 high schooler registrations
- We collaborate with community groups, colleges, non-profits and with the NJ Department of Education to maximize the program's effectiveness.
